# TRINITY SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY

We want children at Trinity to wear their school unifom with pride. Our school w1iform policy supports the schools high standards and ensures a strong sense of identity amongst our pupils. We have tried to ensure that our uniform is comfortable, practical, smart and as low-cost as possible.

We ask that all parents, carers and children respect the school uniform policy.

If we find that a child is wearing clothing not specified on the W1iform list without good reason, we will send a letter home reminding parents and carers of the school policy. We want our children to take pride in their appearance

All uniform should be labelled, either with a laundry marker pen or with an iron-on/sewn-in label

All items marked with an asterisk\* below are available exclusively via SIMPLY SCHOOLWEAR, our school uniform supplier.

## **BOYS**

Grey school trousers (no combat-style trousers, tracksuit-bottoms or jeans) Grey school short trousers (no combat-style shorts, board shorts or 3/4 cut off trousers) School Polo shirt with school logo\* (phasing out plain polo shirts from September 2011)

School round-neck sweatshirt\* and/or school v-neck jumper\*

Plain dark grey or black socks

Black shoes (no trainers, crocs or boots)

Black or brown sandals in summer

None of the following are acceptable: trainers, crocs, boots, coloured or patterned socks

# **BOYS PE (to be kept in school PE bag)**

Plain Navy track suit bottoms

Navy shorts


School sports t-shirt\*

School "hoody" (optional, and for PE only)

Plain plimsolls (Reception Children)

Trainers (Years 1-6)

Swimming trunks\*\* (not board-shorts) for swimming lessons (juniors only)



## **GIRLS**

School polo shirt\* (phasing out plain polo shirts after sept 2011)

School round-neck sweatshirt\* and/or school cardigan with logo\*

Grey school skirt, tunic or grey trousers

Navy or grey tights or socks

Black or navy shoes or sandals (trainers, crocs or boots are not acceptable)

#### **GIRLS SUMMER UNIFORM**

Pale blue gingham/checked dress

School cardigan with logo\* (phasing out plain navy- blue cardigan.from Sept 2011) White socks

Older girls may wear navy cycling shorts under their dress, but these should not be visible beneath the skirt hemline

Shoes (black or navy) or sandals (black, navy or white)

Trainers, crocs or boots are not acceptable. Coloured sandals are not acceptable.

## **ALL PUPILS**

## Painting/Craft Overall

All pupils should have a named, long-sleeved painting overall. This may be an old (larger sized) shirt, or a "shop-bought" overall (option available from our supplier).

**Jewellery:** A suitable watch for school and plain stud ear-rings are permitted but other items of jewellery are not a part of the school unifom1 and may prove hazardous in some school activities. Ear-rings must be removed or taped over for swimming.

**Hair** - long hair should always be tied back with smart, plain bands, clips or ribbons.

#### Coats/Outer-wear

All pupils will need to bring an appropriate coat or mac to school at all times - we do allow children to play outside in very light rain. A waterproof school coat\* is available from our supplier, and is optional.

<u>Sun-safety-</u> all children should bring a named sun-hat to school during warmer weather. School sun-hats\* are available.

**Bags** Infants should own a school book bag\* which should be used for all school books and letters. Juniors may use the school book bag or a larger back-pack style bag\*. Packed lunches should be in a separate lunch bag to avoid spillage onto school books and materials.
