

## **Key achievements to date:**

- Children enjoy a wide variety of competition: dance, football, tag rugby, squash, cross country events and inter school competitions.
- Children have experienced additional high quality PE lessons delivered by experienced coaches who focus on the development of the whole child supporting physical, emotional and social well-being.
- Our PE leader organises a number of events with other schools including participation in a national netball event.
- Development of our Sports Day to include a wider range of events and participation for <u>all children</u>. The our families attending were full of praise; a wonderful day was had by all.
- The review of our lettings policy has encouraged the letting of our site for summer camps.

## Areas for further improvement.

- Increase confidence, knowledge and skills of staff in teaching PE and sport. At present we are heavily reliant on Sports Coaches to deliver PE across the school.
- Allocate more time within the school day for staff to be able to organise sport opportunities between schools so that we increase our participation within inter-school competition and events.
- Develop further the partnership between the Henley Primary Schools to support further inter-school events.
- Develop new roles and responsibilities for identified staff within our school to organize and encourage children's participation in events within and beyond school.
- Develop further out swimming programme and assessment procedures so that we track more rigorously the swimming competencies of our children.
